FILMMAKING A

INTERVIEW TECHNICAL GUIDELINES

CAMERA

- Interviewer should be positioned next to the camera.
 Interviewer's face should be level with the camera lens so that the eye-line of the interview subject is just to the side of the camera.
- 2. Do not make the subject of an interview look directly into the camera.
- 3. The height of the camera is eye-level to the subject.
- 4. The size of the subject in the frame should range from a medium shot to a close-up. No long shots or extreme close-ups.
- 5. Make sure there isn't too much headroom. The space between the subject's head and the top of the frame should be minimal.
- 6. Angle the subject to the left or right side of the frame.

 Do not put the subject in the middle of the frame.
- 7. Position the camera close to the subject, between 6 and 12 feet.
- 8. Zoom in close that that the subject's face can be seen clearly.

LIGHTING

- 1. Do not position the subject in front of a window or other light source. Position the subject either facing the window or 90 degrees from the window.
- 2. If possible, avoid overhead lighting, which will cast shadows over the subject's eyes.
- 3. Use a regular lamp with a 60- to 100-watt bulb and place it next to the interviewer. That way, the subject will be looking toward a light source and the audience will be able to see the person's eyes clearly.
- 4. If a light source other than overhead lights is not available, then the interviewer should position herself slightly higher than the subject so that the subject's eyes are looking up just a bit.

SOUND

- 1. Pick a quiet location.
- 2. Use an external microphone, for example, a shotgun microphone, which picks up sound only where it is pointing.
- 3. Test for reverberation. Echoes will make it difficult to understand what is being said.

LOCATION

- 1. Try to place the subjects in a setting that tells the audience something about the person.
- 2. Use a location that is safe.
- 3. Use a location that has convenient access to restrooms and refreshments.
- 4. Make sure you have permission to use the location.
